

The Grassroots Group of Second Class Citizens (GGSCC) is a group of women from central Illinois who engage in nonviolent direct actions and dramatic protests in order to break the silence surrounding the oppression of women. We join in a tradition of nonviolent direct action established by progressive social movements in the U.S. and declare our solidarity with all those struggling for an end to injustice, inequality and oppression.

"BE MILITANT EACH IN YOUR OWN WAY." Emmeline Pankhurst

Beginning in December of 1981, a group of women from Champaign-Urbana and neighboring communities in Illinois came together to organize a series of direct actions that would confront the Illinois legislature with its responsibility to ratify the Equal Rights Amendment. We were of diverse backgrounds and opinions but were united in the belief that it was time to undertake more dramatic and confrontational tactics.

Our first action was the Day of Rebellion on June 3, 1982. While 200 women conducted a demonstration in the Capitol Rotunda, 17 of us chained ourselves together and to the brass rails in front of the Senate chamber. The chains were intended to link us to our foremothers in the suffrage movement and to symbolize the legal, economic and social chains that still bind women today.

For the first time in US history women remained in occupation of a state capitol; after four days and nights we were forcibly removed by the Secretary of State's security forces in a pre-dawn raid described by the St. Louis Post-Dispatch as "dictatorial and cowardly."


During the following weeks we carried out numerous actions, including sit-ins at the Governor's office, the office of the Speaker of the House, and on the floor of the House itself. On June 25 after the Senate defeated the ERA, several of us wrote the names of opponents of the ERA in blood on the marble floors of the Capitol. The blood was intended to symbolize not only the centuries of violence, hatred and injustice imposed upon women in this country, but also a renewal of the struggle for women's freedom. The police arrested and jailed eight women on felony charges for pouring the blood and another woman for "obstructing justice."

On July 2, twelve members of the group were sentenced for violating a court injunction by wearing chains while sitting in at the Governor's office on June 21. Ten spent four days in jail (ironically over the Independence Day weekend) and were fined \$300 each. Two spent twenty-seven days in jail for making separate statements emphasizing their acts of conscientious civil disobedience.

On August 25, 1982, eight members of the group who had been charged with felonies in connection with the blood-writing demonstration on June 25, were found guilty of misdemeanors and were required to pay a total of approximately \$3,600 for restitution, court costs, and clerk fees. The Grassroots Group was charged over \$9,000 in fines, lawyers' fees, and other legal expenses for the campaign during the month of June.

On Father's Day, do something for children. Consider that 3 out of 5 female children, and 2 out of 7 male children will be sexually abused by the time they are 18 in Champaign-Urbana. 97% of child molesters are heterosexual men.

Take Responsibility. Educate Yourself. Take Action.

Child Sexual Abuse is:

- *Mostly committed by someone the child knows and trusts—a brother, father, neighbor, teacher, etc.
- *Inappropriate touching--fondling, oral sex, vaginal or anal intercourse of the child, or encouraging the child to perform these acts with an adult or another child.

*Inappropriate sexual comments, suggestions, flirtations

- *Inappropriate exposure—exhibitionism, showing kids pornography, engaging in sexual activity in front of a child, watching a child undress
- *Any activity which is sexually arousing to the adult

*Always the responsibility of the adult

CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE IS AN ABUSE OF POWER.

Child Sexual Abuse is Always Harmful;

*85% of runaways were sexually abused as children

*80% of prostitutes were sexually abused as children

*Child sexual abuse is linked to drug addiction, alochol abuse, depression, suicide

*Adult survivors of child sexual abuse also may experience difficulty in relationships, fear of intimacy, continued victimization, migraines, arthritis, and other illnesses.

*Male victims often become child molesters

THE EFFECTS OF CHILD SEXUAL ABUSE LAST A LIFETIME

WHAT YOU CAN DO:

*If you are molesting a child, STOP

*Get help to stop molesting, call Champaign County Mental Health, 398-8080; Family Services, 384-1911; Parents Anonymous, 352-6995

*To report child sexual abuse call 1-800-252-2873. This call is toll free and may be made anonymously

*Victims can contact Rape Crisis Services, 384-4444.

*Educate yourself on the problem. Read books about incest from the victim's point of view such as The Silent Childre n. by Linda Tschirhart-Sanford.

"Talk about incest and sexual abuse in your household, let children know they can say "No" to adults. Encourage them to talk to you about any touch from an adult that they are not comfortable with. Let them know they can and should tell you and that you will always believe them.

*Set up educational groups for men about incest and sexual abuse in your church, synagogue or elsewhere, or get them to sponsor workshops, speakouts, etc. on the subject of sexual abuse.

*Encourage your schools to offer programs for school children and their parents to identify and prevent sexual abuse.

*Alert your legislators and social welfare agencies that you feel more tax monies should be allocated for this.
